

# Housing Profile



#### **Homeowners**

**Blight:** More than one-third of District D has blight rates of 15% or higher. In parts of the St. Bernard, Florida Area, Desire, St. Claude, and 7th Ward neighborhoods more than 25% of parcels had code violations or guilty findings.



### Affordability – Renters

Most (72%) renter households in District D are cost-burdened, the highest percentage of any council district. Measures of cost-burden are based on the federal definition of paying more than 30% of one's income toward rent and utilities. The neighborhoods with the highest percentages of cost-burdened renters include:

# Rental Housing Quality

Housing quality data is not available for small areas. The following statistics apply to the roughly 63,700 apartments in the City of New Orleans. They are likely reflective of District D given the area's large number of renters.



- **2,300** units had **mold** in the last 12 months.
- **4,900** units experienced water leakage from outside the structure.
- **4,400** units experienced water leakage from inside the structure.
- **5,600** units had signs of **rodents**.
- **3,200** units have a **crumbling** foundation

Approximately **4,600** units have reported major problems with the plumbing, heating, electricity, or upkeep.
